A graduate of William Penn High School in High Point. Jerry Camp founded C&D Industrial Tools & Supplies, Inc.; now conducting business nationwide. He was High Point Chamber of Commerce Small Business Person of the Year in 1997; former member of the Advisory Board for Wachovia Bank/High Point and former member of the board for Big Brothers/Big Sisters Board; and he helped secure funding for Joseph's House, a home for homeless children and young adults in Greensboro, North Carolina.
